Batmobiles Go Drag Racing!!



Two of America's coolest cars ever recently battled in a race set up by Super Power Beat Down.


The website decided to see what would happen when the 1966 Batmobile took on the 1989 Batmobile. You'd think that 23 years worth of technology would be worth something, but you'll have to watch the video to find out for sure. By the way, these aren't the original cars used in the movie and TV show, but instead are replicas built by Mark Towle. He says the 1966 replica is built on a C4 Corvette platform with an L98 fuel-injected engine capable of about 300 or 325-hp and a top speed of 150 to 160mph. The 1989, meanwhile, features a Camaro front clip on a custom frame with a 350 Chevy crate motor rated at 285-hp and a top speed of about 180mph.

Asked which one he would pick in a race, Towle said he and a crew member would race to find out and he invited two passengers, Damian Beurer of acomicbooknerd.com in the '66 and Andy Liegl of publicattack.net in the '89. Before the race, Andy pointed out that the '89 has features like grenades coming out of the tires, a side-mounted disc launcher, machine guns on the hood, aircraft-like controls with a self-diagnostic system, voice activation, voice recognition, and even a CD burner! The '66, Damian noted, is atomic powered, voice activated, and has a direct link back to the Batcave. Which one has the Corvette ties?

Amazing Project: Wayne Bickley's Electric C4!



<u>California</u> is <u>wonderful</u>. There's sun, sand, surf, In-N-Out Burger, and a host of other things which make the Golden State worthy of its name. But its stringent emissions regulations make life difficult for car enthusiasts, and after trying to get his supercharged 396 Corvette through testing, Wayne Bickley went green. But he didn't buy a Prius—he converted his C4 to electric power.

Currently, the powertrain features a nine-inch, 100HP motor, a clutchless six-speed and 18 XP1000 batteries. To keep everything balanced, eight are situated up front where the radiator used to be, while the remaining ten sit on a custom rack in the fuel tank's old spot. With this set up, he's been able to manage 22 to 30 miles on a charge and hit a top speed of 85MPH. He hasn't lost his need for speed though, and a beefier 11-inch Netgain HV unit is on the way. After posting videos of the 'Vette on YouTube, Wayne says he's heard from a lot of "arm chair engineers" who have all kinds of suggestions about how he could have done a better job. But he spends his days doing Advanced Visualization—think 3D flight simulation and molecular modeling—and has taken all the comments with a grain of salt. One suggestion he'd like to follow? Using lithium batteries. But at 20K for the juice boxes alone, that's not really on the table.

1968 L88 Corvette Roadster Sells for \$625,000 at Russo and Steele



We tuned in to Saturday evening's live stream of the <u>Russo and Steele auction</u> to catch some of rare Corvettes that were offered for sale. This 1968 L88 Corvette Roadster was one of the major attractions at the Scottsdale auction and it sure didn't disappoint, selling for a cool \$625,000. With the 10% buyer's commission, price <u>out the door</u> was \$687,500.

Russo and Steele's catalog description of the L88 Roadster called it the best documented L88 Roadster in existence. Of 216 L88 Corvettes made in 1968, just 20 were <u>roadsters</u> and only this L88 roadster is believed to have been ordered with two tops. Fully documented with just two owners in its history, the car underwent a restoration and was once featured on the cover of Corvette Fever.

Bidding on the rare Corvette opened at \$200,000 and never stopped until the hammer fell at \$625,000.
